

A Funny New Bat: The Baseball Cat

Preparation (1 minute):

- Cue your screen to the beginning of Episode 2: The Baseball Cat https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=ddhEvPqPC0U
- If you haven't done so already, click on the "Subscribe" button to be alerted to new content.
- Provide each student with a blank piece of drawing paper (for the end of the lesson).

Lesson (15 minutes):

- 1. Ask students to indicate if they have ever watched or played baseball by giving a "thumbs up" or "thumbs" down. Briefly discuss what they know about the game. Tell students that they are going to a watch a show about a very unusual baseball game.
- 2. Play **Episode 2: The Baseball Cat**. Pause at 1:17. Ask students to predict what they think is going to happen next. Respond positively to students' predictions.
- 3. Watch the remainder of the episode.
- 4. Remind students of how the Sound Snatcher switched the /b/ in bat with a /k/ and turned the baseball bat into a baseball cat. Encourage students to recall how Sounder and her friends solved the problem.
- 5. Tell students they are going to practice switching sounds in words just like the Sound Snatcher!

- 6. Encourage students to draw a picture of themselves as a batter at a baseball game. If they wish, in place of the bat, invite them to draw another object that rhymes with bat.
- 7. Invite students to share their pictures. If they wish, they can pretend to be the Sound Snatcher and demonstrate how they switched a sound in the word bat to create a new word.
